Summary

The Ashley Lynne Busby Memorial Scholarship award will be granted to a graduating senior who has shown a passion and engagement with both the sciences and the arts, and intends to pursue a college degree upon completion of high school. Evaluation will be based on the criteria outlined below, with emphasis on the overall record rather than a strictly weighted formula.

Eligibility

An award will be made to a graduating senior. Distribution of funds is contingent upon his or her matriculation as a full-time student in a degree-seeking program at any accredited college or university in the United States. The award will be paid to the college or university on the recipient's behalf upon presentation by the student of evidence of enrollment.
